Reference: Scholarship Rules

The Scholarship Committee of EANGUS Auxiliary is accepting applications for the school year 2021-2022. If funds are available, one USAA scholarship in the amount of \$3,000.00 will be awarded to the number one ranked applicant; one EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship in the amount of \$2,000.00 will be awarded to the number two ranked applicant; one EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship in the amount of \$1,500.00 will be awarded to the third ranked applicant; the fourth and fifth ranked applicants will receive \$1,000.00 each.

1. Please read materials carefully before giving any applications to candidates. Be prepared to give assistance if needed. No previous recipients are allowed to apply again.

2. In order for each application to be considered, it MUST contain the following documentation – NO EXCEPTIONS.

a. Official High School/College Transcripts.

b. Three signed and dated Letters of Recommendation.

c. **Signed and dated** letter from Applicant containing future goals and need for assistance. The letter must not be less than three hundred fifty (350) words and not to exceed five hundred (500) words.

d. A Letter of Recommendation and Transmittal from the State Auxiliary President, Scholarship Chairperson or Designee indicating that the application is in order and has all documentation.

- 3. EANGUS Auxiliary sponsor must have dues paid to National Auxiliary no later than December 31, 2020.
- 4. For applicants to be eligible, sponsor's State Auxiliary must make a donation to the EANGUS Auxiliary

Scholarship Fund for the current and prior year. (Mandatory donation is \$2.00 per member annually payable by December 31.)

It will be the responsibility of each State to make the information available to their membership. You may copy the application, however, DO NOT reduce it. Each State is to designate a Scholarship Chairperson and the applications returned to that person by a specific date. The application should then be reviewed to ensure all requirements have been met. Any incorrect applications received by the National Committee will be considered ineligible.

Each scholarship application to be considered by the National Committee must be mailed to Liz Bryant, 1 C Camino de Pinones, Glorieta, NM 87535. If there are any questions, I can be reached at labrab0704@gmail.com. Packets must be postmarked no later than June 30, 2021 to be considered.

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States Auxiliary Scholarship Awards Program is as follows:

The following persons are eligible:

- 1. EANGUS Auxiliary Members
- 2. Unmarried, children/step children, grandchildren/step grandchildren, up to age 26, of Annual and Life EANGUS Auxiliary Members.
- 3. Spouses of EANGUS Auxiliary Members

Verification of membership in the EANGUS Auxiliary of the mother, father, step mother/father, grandparents/step grandparents, spouse or self is necessary for applicants to be eligible.

For applicants to be eligible, sponsor's State Auxiliary must have made a donation to the EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship fund for the current year and the prior year. (Mandatory amount is \$2.00 per member per year payable by 31 December.)

Applicants must be enrolled at a university, college, business or trade school taking a minimum of eight accredited hours. <u>**Graduate students are not eligible**.</u>

An alternate recipient will be selected in case a recipient is unable to accept the award.

There shall be no consideration whatsoever given by the judges because of rank or grade of applicant, applicant's parents/step parents, grandparents/step grandparents or applicant's spouse.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, character, leadership and need.

All applications must be accompanied by the following documentation:

- 1. An official transcript of high school credits and/or college credits for applicants already enrolled in institutions of higher learning.
- 2. **Signed and dated** letter from applicant with specific goals to continue his/her education and why financial aid is required, not less than three hundred fifty (350) words and not to exceed five hundred (500) words.
- 3. Three **signed and dated** letters of recommendation verifying the application and giving general personal traits. These may be from high school principal, counselor, dean, professor, minister, employer, etc.
- 4. A letter of recommendation and transmittal from State Auxiliary President, Scholarship Chairperson or Designee.

Checks will be sent directly to the recipient, made payable to the institution of the recipient's choice, when verification of current enrollment is received by the committee chairperson.

These are one-time awards and shall not be repeated. Non-recipients may reapply so long as stated requirements are met. If the school term is not completed, due to cause other than sickness or injury, the student will refund the scholarship award in full to the EANGUS Auxiliary.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of funds availability for the current year and the number of applicants.

BILLS AND ITEMS OF INTEREST: We've been actively monitoring bills or items of interest since the 117th Congress convened and are working with Congressional offices as we kick off our advocacy efforts on behalf of our members. We will continue to monitor each of these and any other emerging bills and will keep you informed. We use our monthly Drill Weekend Talking Points to provide those updates and will also initiate "Call to Action" messages, as needed. We encourage you to share the information below and the talking points with other National Guard members to let them know what we're working on.

HR 6280 - RESERVIST PAY EQUITY ACT OF 2021 - On February 4, 2021, Congressmen Jimmy Panetta (CA) and Brad Wenstrup (OH) reintroduced this bill to encourage employers to continue to pay employees that are members of the National Guard and Reserves while activated. Employers who hire military reservists and National Guard members are not required to pay those servicemembers when they are deployed. However, employers may receive a tax credit for paying differential wages to their employed military reservists and National Guard members which helps these servicemembers offset financial challenges while activated. The bipartisan Reservist Pay Equity Act increases the tax credit employers receive from 20% to 50%. Regarding HR 6280, Congressman Panetta said, "Our bipartisan legislation increases the employer tax credit to encourage more employers to offer differential wage pay to employees while they answer the call of duty for our nation. As National Guard members and reservists remain on the frontlines at home and abroad, it's legislation like this that will help maintain the financial security of these devoted Americans." EANGUS has offered our support for HR 6280 in a statement that read: "The membership of the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the U.S. (EANGUS) supports the Reservist Pay Equity Act. We thank Congressman Panetta and Congressman Wenstrup for introducing this legislation that encourages employers to pay our reserve component service members fairly and encourages companies to employ reservists during state status and in service to our country. EANGUS understands the sacrifice of the servicemember and the employer."

RESERVE EMPLOYERS COMPREHENSIVE REFIEF AND UNiFORM INCENTIVES ON TAXES ACT OF 2021 - Congressman Tim Ryan (OH), co-chair of the National Guard Caucus, also plans to reintroduce a bill he sponsored in the 116th Congress which will establish a tax credit for employers of National Guard and Reserve members. The tax credit for the employer is equal to \$1,000 for each reservist employed during the year, plus an additional amount that ranges from \$3,000 to \$10,000, depending on the number of days the reservist serves in the uniformed services during the year. The measure is intended to give employers an incentive to hire and keep workers who are members of the Guard and Reserve, and also to offset some of the cost of having employees who are called away on military duties. The Military Coalition supported Congressman Ryan's bill last year stating, "This bill addresses one of the biggest challenges that these reservists face—finding and retaining employment with businesses who support their service and bear the costs of lost productivity during periods of training and deployment." EANGUS is a member of The Military Coalition and supports Congressman's Ryan's efforts on behalf of our members.

H.R. 303: RETIRED PAY RESTORATION ACT: This bill was introduced on January 13, 2021 by Congressman Gus Bilirakis (FL), and would amend Title 10, United States Code, to permit additional retired members of the Armed Forces who have a service-connected disability to receive both disability compensation from the Department of Veterans Affairs and either retired pay by reason of their years of military service or combat-related special compensation. Under current law, only individuals with service-connected disabilities rated at 50% or more receive both retirement pay and VA disability compensation without offset. This legislation addresses the issue known as Concurrent Receipt. Similarly, during the 116th Congress, Congressman Bilirakis introduced the Major Richard Star Act, which would have secured the right of concurrent receipt for approximately 43,000 Chapter 61 retirees injured in combat zones. Chapter 61 retirees are service members who were medically retired due to injuries sustained on duty prior to achieving 20 years in service. Major (Ret) Star, age 51, passed away on Saturday, February 13, 2021 after a years-long battle with lung cancer linked to exposure to burn pits while on deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan. Congressman Bilirakis and Senator John Tester (MT) plan to reintroduce the Major Richard Star Act in the 117th Congress later this month. On February 17, 2021, EANGUS signed on to a letter penned by The Military Coalition to support this bill.

DOD ASKED TO CLARIFY SHIFTING POLICY IMPACTING GI BILL ELIGIBILITY: Congressman Mike Bost (IL), the Ranking Member of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, released the following statement after sending a letter to Secretary of Defense, Lloyd J. Austin III, regarding National Guard members' eligibility for GI Bill benefits following the Biden Administration's recent termination of the national emergency declaration at the southern border. "The Biden Administration's decision to reverse the emergency declaration at the southern border risks national security. It also risks the education of thousands of members of the National Guard who are still deployed there," said Ranking Member Bost. "Secretary Austin must immediately tell us whether those serving at the border since January 20th are receiving the same credit toward the GI Bill that they were on January 19th. Their service has not changed. Their benefits should not change either. The National Guard has stepped up in extraordinary ways over the last year. They have left their families and lives behind to serve on federal duty at the border, in DC, and elsewhere. Every single one of them should receive full GI Bill credit for their service. I stand ready to work with the Secretary to make sure they get exactly that."

Congressman Bost asked for clarification on whether the rescission of Presidential Proclamation 9844 eliminates the ability for members of the National Guard currently serving on the southern border to continue to receive credit towards Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits and, if so, how that is being communicated to them. EANGUS is monitoring this issue and is committed to supporting any follow-on legislation that might be needed.

Obituary—Charles "Chuck" Geary Jr, age 86, of New Augusta, went home to be with his Lord and Savior on February 14, 2021. He was born on June 24, 1934 in Braintree, MA to the late Charles Geary Sr. and Mabel Wentworth Geary.

Mr. Geary was an active member of Calvary Baptist Church in Petal, MS where he served as Chairman of the Deacons as well as Treasurer. He loved his church, serving the Lord, and all the people in his church.

Bost Urges DoD to Clarify Shifting Policy Impacting GI Bill Eligibility

Rep. Mike Bost (R-IL.), the Ranking Member of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, released the following statement after sending a letter to Secretary of Defense, Lloyd J. Austin III, regarding National Guard Members' eligibility for GI Bill benefits following the Biden Administration's recent termination of the national emergency declaration at the southern border.

"The Biden Administration's decision to reverse the emergency declaration at the southern border risks national security. It also risks the education of thousands of members of the National Guard who are still deployed there," said Ranking Member Bost. "Secretary Austin must immediately tell us whether those serving at the border since January 20th are receiving the same credit toward the GI Bill that they were on January 19th. Their service has not changed. Their benefits should not change either. The National Guard has stepped up in extraordinary ways over the last year. They have left their families and lives behind to serve on federal duty at the border, in DC, and elsewhere. Every single one of them should receive full GI Bill credit for their service. I stand ready to work with the Secretary to make sure they get exactly that."

The status of servicemembers of the National Guard currently serving at the southern border includes end strength and the statutory authority for their service. Rep. Bost asked for clarification on whether the rescission of Presidential Proclamation 9844 eliminates the ability for members of the National Guard currently serving on the southern border to continue to receive credit towards Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits and, if so, how that is being communicated to them.

As EANGUS members know, we are continually pushing for our well-deserved benefits. We will continue to monitor this situation and ensure everyone is receiving updated information. We will be assisting Rep. Bost with any follow on legislation he feels is needed.



OXFORD, Miss. – A former governor and champion of education and racial reconciliation initiatives whose public service career started while a University of Mississippi student, William Winter has died, leaving behind a lasting legacy throughout the Magnolia State and beyond.

Winter, who was known broadly as "Mississippi's education governor" and accounted for nearly 75 years of public service, died on Friday, December 18, at the age of 97.

Winter (BA 43, LLB 49) served as governor of Mississippi from 1980 to 1984, during which he played pivotal roles in securing the passage of landmark educational initiatives in 1982 bringing kindergartens, compulsory school attendance and a number of other critical reform measures to the state.

"We are saddened to learn that the much respected and beloved Gov. William Winter passed away," UM Chancellor Glenn Boyce said. "As a distinguished statesman and prominent University of Mississippi alumnus, his outstanding leadership and advocacy has shaped our state and university in countless ways. His enduring legacy lives on in the lasting impact of his accomplishments in advancing education, racial reconciliation, equality and numerous other areas.

"We extend our deepest condolences and prayers to his family and the entire state for this great loss."

Before serving as governor, Winter was elected to the offices of state representative, state tax collector, state treasurer and lieutenant governor. He served as chairman of the Southern Regional Education Board, the Commission on the Future of the South, the National Civic League, the Kettering Foundation, the Foundation for the Mid-South and the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. In 1978, he served as president of the Ole Miss Alumni Association.

In 2017, Winter was inducted into the Ole Miss Alumni Association's Hall of Fame, receiving the Alumni Service Award, given to those with a record of service to the university and the Alumni Association over an extended period.

Winter was a member of President Bill Clinton's National Advisory Board on Race in 1997, which led to the founding of the William Winter Institute for Racial Reconciliation at UM in 1999.

"With the passing of Governor William F. Winter, Mississippi has lost one of its greatest champions of equality, reconciliation and progress; and I have lost a friend, an inspiration and one of the finest people I've ever known," Clinton said in a **statement**. "Bill had the gift to see his state as it was, to envision what it could be and to take the difficult but

necessary steps to get there. His bold efforts to reform education, fight poverty and bring people together across racial lines showed the promise of a new Mississippi."

In 1998, Winter was the recipient of the Mississippi Bar's Lifetime Achievement Award. His credentials within the academic community are longstanding: Jamie Whitten Professor of Law and Government at the UM School of Law (1989); Eudora Welty Professor of Southern Studies at Millsaps College (1989); and fellow of the Institute of Politics at Harvard University (1985).

In remarks made in 2003, the historian David Halberstam called Winter "Mississippi's best and strongest governor of modern times." Halberstam went on to say, "Winter, more than any other politician, is the architect of the new Mississippi and the new America."

He was awarded the Profile in Courage Award by the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation for demonstrating the qualities of politically courageous leadership. At the time of the announcement in 2008, Caroline Kennedy, president of the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation, said, "Gov. William Winter gives testimony to President Kennedy's belief that politics can truly be a noble profession.

"His lifetime of public service, both to his country and his beloved state of Mississippi, has been distinguished by its devotion to equality and justice. His lifelong dedication to ensuring equal opportunities in our nation's educational system embodies what it means to be a profile in courage."

Born in Grenada, Winter served overseas as an infantry officer in the Pacific in World War II. After service in the U.S. Army, Winter was elected to the Mississippi Legislature in 1947 while still a student at the School of Law.

Andy Mullins, who served for nearly two decades at Ole Miss, was a member of Gov. Winter's staff, one of the "Boys of Spring" who helped engineer the landmark Education Reform Act of 1982. Mullins said Winter was an avid Ole Miss sports fan and even served as sports editor of The Daily Mississippian when he was a student.

"In his early life, he wanted to be a sportswriter and his memory of Ole Miss sports was incredible," Mullins said of Winter. "You could ask him who Ole Miss beat in a bowl game on this year and he could not only tell you who they played, but what the score of the game was."

Besides his love of Ole Miss sports, Winter was an overwhelming supporter of the university and the role UM played in helping advance the state, Mullins said.

"He was a big proponent of research at Ole Miss – and all the universities in the state, really – being a major driver of recruiting industry to Mississippi," Mullins said. "He loved Ole Miss from the time he was a student until the day he died. His death is a big loss for the University of Mississippi, as well as the entire state of Mississippi."

Reflecting on Winter's legacy, businessman and former Secretary of State Dick Molpus (BBA '71), another member of the "Boys of Spring," said, "Winter confronted racial, economic and educational inequities throughout his life and fought those inequities with courage, hope and tenacity."

Winter is survived by his wife of 70 years, Elise Varner Winter (BA 48). He is also survived by three devoted daughters, Anne Winter, Lele Gillespie and Eleanor Winter, along with five grandchildren, Dr. Winter Williams, Dr. Zach Williams, Ty Gillespie, Caroline Gillespie and Grace Gillespie, and five great grandchildren.
